FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Family and Friends of Grace UMC,

We are officially in the fall season. Days are warm, but not too warm, and nights are cool. School and sports are in full swing. The leaves are beginning to change color, and we are reminded once again, that there is great beauty in this season. But we also know that this year, this season can be difficult. There is a lot of angst in our society, and we often forget who we are and whose we are when feelings are high and strong. We forget the words of Jesus, to do unto others as you would have them do unto you, and act and react in ways that betray who we really are – created in God's image and beloved.

Adam Hamilton and the Church of the Resurrection has put together a campaign called *Do Unto Others* (<u>Kindness - Resurrection Church</u>), which also has a worship series of the same name, created by Worship Design Studio. As we remind ourselves about the Golden Rule, we will spend time relearning how the simple ideas of kindness, respect, love, humility and compassion, create real

change in our lives and in our world. Worship Design Studio introduces this series as follows:

Just as water reflects the face, so one human heart reflects another. – Proverbs 27:19

Our world seems to be consumed with division—often typified in the colors red and blue. Rather than stay in our monochromatic silos, the Golden Rule in scripture challenges us to engage in conversation and seek to create whatever common good we can with our relatives, friends, and neighbors who we might consider to be on the "other side" politically and ideologically. As we attempt to come together, the idea is not that we are obliterating either one or trying to change each other, but rather we discover the beauty that can be created when we work together to make the world a better place. The "purple space" is where we cultivate kindness, compassion, humility, respect, and love for one another and for the good of all the world, no matter what.

I hope that we can find ways to continue to be people of grace as we walk together through this time. For those that like to write their reflections in a space or spend time reflecting on the theme for the week, WSD has created a journal which we will make available. Anyone interested in meeting as a small group to discuss questions or anything that comes up as we go through *Do Unto Others*, please let me know or just go ahead and find a group with whom you'd like to share.

In addition to our series, we still have work to do as we move forward with clearing out items from our church, utilizing the land behind the parsonage, and ideas for how to reach out to the community. Your input, ideas, and assistance in these areas are greatly appreciated and desired. You, the congregation, are Grace UMC! What you want it to be and what it will become is in your hands.
