FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Family and Friends of Grace UMC,

The days are warm, and the nights are getting cooler – sure signs of the end of summer and the entry into fall. College students are already back to classes, and new freshman have been settled in by family. K-12 students will be returning to school soon, which means that their teachers have already begun the work to welcome students for another year of learning and growing.

While all these changes are going on, Grace has continued to be in mission and ministry to and with our community, providing weekly worship, trying out a new ministry of music and stories, and continuing work in the Book Nook and Bargain Shed. We look forward to opportunities to utilize the land behind the parsonage (north of the parking lot) for a community garden and a prayer area. Volunteers are encouraged to step up and help in whatever way you feel called. We are hoping there might be a scout or troop that may want to lend a hand in getting the land ready for these hopes and dreams to come to fruition.

Our worship for this month will be based on the lectionary (the designated readings that are listed in a 3-year cycle). However, while we typically focus on the Gospel or other New Testament readings, we will be focusing on the Old Testament (or Hebrew Bible) readings. These 5 weeks will include readings from Song of Solomon, Proverbs, and Ester. These books are part of what is called Wisdom Literature. The series is called Uncommon Wisdom and was suggested by UMC Discipleship. The genre of Wisdom Literature is "generally more poetic and reflective than the history and moral instruction we find in most of the Hebrew scriptures. It doesn't have a singular theological agenda, but its general goal seems to be an invitation to humanity to use all that God has given us as tools to contemplate God's nature, goodness, and desire for the world. Other pieces of Old Testament literature that fall in this classification include Job, Ecclesiastes, many of the Psalms, and some of the apocryphal books." (UMCDiscipleship.org). This will be a new opportunity for all of us, including me, to explore this part of the lectionary readings.

After this lectionary series is completed, we can continue on with lectionary readings (either returning to the New Testament or exploring more of the Hebrew scriptures), or try a new series. There are two others that I have been looking into. The **first** is called **Do Unto Others**, which is based on a grassroots movement launched by Resurrection, a United Methodist Church in the Kansas City area, to encourage people to be intentional about treating one another with kindness, overcoming the polarization in our country through civility and respect. (Kindness - Resurrection Church). Each week will focus on one aspect of DO UNTO OTHERS: Kindness, Respect, love, humility and compassion. The **2nd** possible series would be **The Bible Doesn't Say That**. This series would look at different sayings that the public assumes are in the Bible, but really aren't – such as *Money is the root of all evil* or *God Helps Those Who Help Themselves.* Feel free to ask questions and give input. Worship belongs to all of us.

I look forward to our continued learning together – through activities, trying new ways of reaching the community, studies and worship so that we can continue to put our faith and love into action and practice.



<u>NEW RESOURCE FROM MISSIONAL EXCELLENCE: HEALTHY</u> <u>CHURCH ACADEMY</u>
